Feedback from the Police and Communities Together (PACT) meeting 31st Jan

Here are a few of the points and issues raised at the meeting.

Re: recent crimes (last six weeks) in West Park, Headingley and Meanwood

- 1. 2 burglaries in the Meanwood Area
- 2. 3 vehicle thefts
- 3. 14 thefts from vehicles
- 4. 7 cases of interference with vehicles

The increase in the number of thefts from vehicles is focused in our area and frequently involves people breaking into vans. A number of these incidents have occurred at the Village Hotel. The police have made four arrests.

Another PCSO has been appointed to work alongside PCSO Reuben Joseph. The team now comprises of.
